



## Train for Jobs in Healthcare!! Taking Applications Now for June Classes!

- Who is Eligible:** Based on Income guidelines – **Eligibility assessed by Iroquois Case Worker**
- Target Audience:** Unemployed young adults, ages 18-24, not currently attending school
- Funding Period:** January 1, 2010 – December 31, 2010 through a NYS Department of Labor grant.
- What's included:** **Career Planning** – Development of a career plan and job goal, working one-on-one in an initial assessment with an Iroquois Health Career Coordinator to determine best fit for placement in a training program matching local employment needs at participating health care employers. All participants will be required to create a portfolio account and resume using **JobZone**; a self-paced, online tool.

**Worker Readiness Training** - Participants will receive basic life skills trainings to provide personal and interpersonal skills to help prepare them for entering the workforce. These trainings are designed to prepare a job seeker to sit for the **National Work Readiness exam** to earn a **National Work Readiness Credential**; a valuable asset in seeking employment.

**Class Dates for Worker Readiness and Job Zone Training:** Mon – Fri, June 21 – June 25, 2010 to be held at the Troy EOC.

**Free Short Term Healthcare Training** - Participants who possess the necessary basic academic skill levels will be enrolled in a local Certified Nurse Assistant training program. Educational training will be offered through the Troy EOC (Educational Opportunity Center) and grant funding would be utilized to cover the costs of tuition, books, fees and uniforms based on provider costs and length of training programs.

Class /Clinicals Mon-Fri, June 30 through August 6, 2010.

Time: 8:30am -3:30pm with lunch break.

Required physicals and medical immunizations due prior to class start. (additional class details will be given during consultation)

**Job Placement** - At the successful completion of the program, participants will be referred for employment at one of the participating health care employers working with the Iroquois Health Career Coordinator/Case Manager.
